

Career Counselling, Coaching and Assessment

OVERVIEW

This course is designed to immerse participants in the field of career development under the expert guidance of senior researcher and practitioner, Professor Jim Bright. The course is administered by BECOME Education and provides a professional grounding in career counselling and careers education.

The Career Counselling, Coaching and Assessment Course is for:

- People wanting to offer Career Counselling, Coaching and Assessment services to students in schools and higher education or business clients.
- Existing practitioners keen to develop new skills and refresh their knowledge.
- New and existing practitioners who want to be inspired by the latest evidence and best practice.

The course covers:

- How and when career decisions are made, and the role of the careers professional.
- Improved knowledge of current research in career development and planning.
- Ways to enhance self-efficacy and confidence in career exploration..
- An understanding of the changing nature of work and the effect of uncertainty in career planning.
- Strategies that go beyond matching approaches to careers.

Course length: 20 hours of study

Two course formats are available:

1. INTENSIVE - The 3-day in-person intensive model includes 20 hours of in-person instruction from Prof. Jim Bright. Morning tea and lunch are provided each day. Optional evening networking may occur. For the latest dates, visit https://info.become.education/ccca_overview
2. HYBRID ONLINE - Flexible hybrid delivery with a consistent cohort. Students have 5 months to complete 17 hours of online self-paced learning plus 3 hours of mandatory live online interactive sessions with Prof. Jim Bright. Two intakes per year (January and July) allow participants to access deep material as well as networking with each other.

This course covers key content areas identified in the Australian Professional Standards for Career Development Practitioners. The course covers all of the 'core competencies':

- Career development theory; Labour market information; Communication and interpersonal skills; Ethical practice; Diversity and inclusion; Technology, information and resources; Professional practice application.

Fees

The fee for Career Counselling, Coaching and Assessment course is \$2000 (plus GST).

The fee is the same for each of the two delivery formats: in-person intensive, or hybrid online.

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Course components

There are two components to the CCCA course.

1. Attendance at the full in-person intensive OR attendance at a minimum of 2 of the 3 live interactive online sessions. If this is not possible, for example because of time zone differences, you must contact the course provider for an alternative.
2. Completion of short homework/Course Workbook activities.
Those in the 3-day intensive will be led through a collaborative activity.
Those on the hybrid online course will complete their activities in the Course Workbook.

About the course instructor

Dr Jim Bright is based in Sydney, Australia. He is a practicing psychologist who works with clients in medico-legal matters such as motor vehicle accidents and workplace injuries, as well as coaching elite sports people and executives. He is also director of Research & Impact for BECOME Education and formerly Professor of Career Education and Development at Australian Catholic University.

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Course Terms and Conditions

- Participants can withdraw from the course and receive a full refund until 7 working days before the commencement of the course.

A participant's enrollment may be transferred to another date if available OR transferred to another person, depending on circumstances; this is at the sole discretion of BECOME Education, who will discuss circumstances with the participant.
